**NOTICE OF ORDINANCE ADOPTION  
AND SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE**

PUBLIC NOTICE IS GIVEN that at a regular meeting held on June 27, 2011, the City Commission of the City of Walker, Michigan, adopted Ordinance No. 11-600 entitled:

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 62-2 and 62-3  
OF CHAPTER 62, ARTICLE I OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES,  
CITY OF WALKER, MICHIGAN, ENTITLED "SOLID WASTE - GENERAL"**

The regulatory effect of Ordinance No. 11-600 is summarized as follows:

Section 1 amends Section 62-2 of the Code of Ordinances with respect to solid waste and solid waste container regulations and requires the keeping of a suitable and properly sealed solid waste container for depositing solid waste and prohibiting litter or permitting littering; requires the maintenance of one or more solid waste containers; requires emptying any solid waste container which contains organic material from premises not less frequently than once a week; and, prohibits the storage of a solid waste container in the front yard of any premises except during the 24 hours immediately before it is removed or emptied.

Section 2 amends Section 62-3 of the Code of Ordinances with respect to the identification of solid waste containers and requires that a solid waste container having a capacity of at least one-half cubic yard shall be plainly marked with the name and current street address or the name and current telephone number of the waste hauler; mandates that the solid waste hauler comply with this article; and, defines "solid waste container."

Section 3 provides that all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict are, to the extent of such conflict, repealed.

Section 4 states that the Ordinance is declared to be an emergency ordinance and will become effective immediately upon publication in a newspaper in general circulation within the City.
